- Our district is participating in a \$250,000 multi district disaster response grant for Ukraine
- Clubs and individuals have invested in our Global Grant *Water for the World* project in Honduras scheduled to be on site in the spring
- A Global Grant is being finalized to teach surgeons in Asia how to cure cleft palate a project that will empower local surgeons to make an impact for years and years
- Details are being finalized on a Global Grant to bring clean water to Haiti
